FOYER:

We do need a kind of foyer for welcoming audience during inlet and to perform in at halftime. For that purpose also a space in front of the theatre is possible to use, if we can pitch a big top of round about 50 m² there. For its decoration we do need some colored Pin-Spots and PAR 56. If necessary we can bring along our own technique.

STAGE:

Playing area 15 m wide I 9 m deep I 5 m high – or higher! Playing area possible in a round tent, if inner diameter min. 15 m width and sidewalls min. 3 m high Completely dark room with dark walls, if possible without curtains! Dark stage floor, it gets dirty by water and soil 7 stage platforms, each 2 m x 1 m, height-adjustable from 0,8 m to 1,1 m Rigging points for one ceiling lamp and for two snatch blocks to pull a car tire fixed on a rope with sandbag up and down Rigging points for duvetyn above the stage setting Duvetine, min. 13x (3 m x 6 m)

Everyone in the audience must be able to see the stage floor! No more than 200 people!

If necessary, we bring along: 7 stage platforms, each 2 m x 1 m, height-adjustable from 0,8 m to 1,1 m Duvetyn

LIGHTS:

We even use yours but if necessary, we also can bring along ours.

These lights we would use from theatre:

- 8x 1000 W Fresnel with flaps
- 9x 500/650 W PC with flaps
- 4x LED PAR 56
- 3x 300 W PAR 56
- 7x 1000 W PAR 64
- 2x 575 W Profile Source four jr. Zoom
- 4x 1200 W Profiler Strand Cantata
- 1x Profile Selecon
- 4x 30 W Pin-Spot

These lights and equipment we bring along:

- 3x Overhead
- 1x 100 W shadow lamp E27 Tripods and base plates for lights at backstage

For installing we do need:

- 27 Connections above with max. 1000W (front stage)
- 11 Connections on the floor with max. 650 W (backstage)

Lighting system:

- 1x Dimmer with 24 channels, 1kW for each channel (our system needs following connections: 1x 125 A or 4 x 32 A)
- 1x Light console with 24 channels

Furthermore: Audience fill lighting on DMX signal

SOUND:

We do need a sound system well adjusted to the room with speakers standing on stage. If necessary, we bring along our own system. We absolutely need one wireless handheld microphone!

ADDITIONAL CONNECTIONS:

5 Schuko sockets at backstage for

- 1x 100 W hand lamp
- 1x 40 W table lamp
- 1x printer
- 2x turntables

1 Schuko socket at front stage, leading from backstage to FOH, for

1x turntable

PYROTECHNICS:

At the end some sparklers are lighted up.

TIME:

Setup for min. 8 hours, depending on room's structure and its preparation by theatre technicians Doors open 30 minutes before. Admittance is part of the show.

1 hour before admittance we need silence for preparation.

Playing time about 2 hours

Deconstruction min. 4 hours, and about 6 hours if we bring along our own technique

TECHNICIANS:


We travel with min. 2 technicians. Additionally we need min. 1 technician for lighting and 1 technician for sound in-house. For setup and deconstruction we need min. 2 technicians in-house.

Dressing room for min. 12 people with washing facility and mirror Parking directly at theatre
